Homestay with Delfina

Delfina's house is on Plaza Pintacha, a ten minute walk away from The Rainbow House, The Rainbow School and the Plaza de Armas.

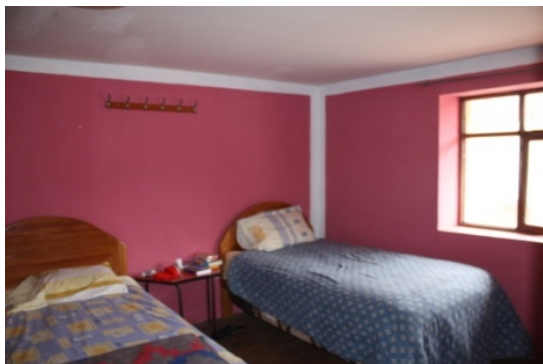
You'll be made to feel very welcome by Delfina, a lovely local pre-school teacher, and her family.

Delfina has recently been made Director of The Rainbow School so you will be working alongside her also!



The house:

- There are twin rooms for volunteers, each with a bedside table, mirror, hooks for your clothes and a chest of drawers.
- Delfina has spare blankets if you get cold at night!
- The living room has big comfy couches for you to relax with the family.
- 2 bathrooms, each with toilet, sink and hot water showers.
- There is an outside sink that you can use to wash your clothes in. Alternatively, for a small charge, Delfina can wash your clothes for you, or you can take your laundry along to a local laundrette.
- There is a small patio at the back of the house which you can use to hang your washing.
- There is a telephone in the house for you to receive calls and make calls with a phone card. However please remember that this is the family telephone so if you want to have a long phone call, it is best to go to a call centre. The telephone number for the house is (0051) (84) 201882.

Family Life: Staying in a homestay gives you an amazing opportunity to experience Peruvian family life. Delfina loves hosting volunteers and is extremely friendly and accommodating. She is involved in local politics and is passionate about social justice so she is very interesting to talk to. Delfina lives with her husband Julio, and her two sons Oscar and Miguel who are both in their twenties and study in Cusco. The whole family take a keen interest in life abroad and will love to hear stories about where you come from and what your life is like. You will also learn a lot about Peru from talking to them, and it's a great chance to practise your Spanish!

The Food: Delfina is a wonderful cook and you will be well fed! We can arrange B&B or half board for you if required.

For breakfast you might get a fried egg sandwich, banana pancakes, or bread and jam. There is coffee or tea, and usually juice too. For dinner, Delfina can cook an extensive variety of different meals, ranging from typical Peruvian food to Western food. Some of the food you will enjoy might include pork escalope, chicken curry, soups, and pasta dishes. She can cater for vegetarians, and will always ask you if there are any foods you don't like or are allergic to, so do let her know.
