

WORKING WITH THE CHILDREN

Volunteers always work in pairs when at the projects and are supported at all times by our experienced on-site Volunteer Managers and professional staff.



- Creative workshops: supporting the children during art classes or other creative activities
- Brain gym: a fun exercise programme that prepares the children for learning
- Playtime: making friends and playing with the children is an important part of the work... and is lots of fun too!
- Sports events: organising mini Olympics, football tournaments or sports days at the projects are great ways to break down the cultural differences and connect with the children in a fun and active way!

PROJECT WORK

Raising funds for a specific project enables the group to see firsthand how their money is being spent, and the impact that their contribution will have on the lives of the children.



Deciding on projects, fundraising and seeing projects through to completion is also an exciting and fun way for young people to develop their skills and initiative.

Projects include:

- Maintenance of existing buildings including painting, varnishing, rebuilding and mending
- Paintings, murals and other creative projects for a welcoming and nurturing environment
- Building needed spaces onsite at the centres such as walls, classrooms etc
- Building a bathroom for a family
- Working on the farm

TRAINING WITH KIYA SURVIVORS

Kiya Survivors' training for young people addresses the skills and knowledge that they will need during their project work and work with the children. Prior to departure groups are offered training covering: working with children with special needs; team working; supporting each other and managing emotions.

On arrival at the centre groups are trained to use local materials for their project working (e.g. making adobe bricks), and receive additional training and support on working with the children.

Training programme outline:

- Team building activities
- History of Kiya Survivors
- Introduction to Special Needs and Disability Awareness
- · Communication skills and dealing with challenging behaviour
- · Volunteering: project work and working with the students
- Emotional literacy: supporting each other
- Preparation for travel
- Fundraising
